Rise Against Hunger is driven by the vision of a world without hunger. Our mission is to end hunger in our lifetime by providing food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable and creating a global commitment to mobilize the necessary resources.

Feeding the hungry is a responsibility given to us by Jesus himself in several scriptural commands. He practiced it, too, in abundance at the feeding of 5,000 people in Bethsaida. We at Trinity UMC, take this responsibility seriously, as evidenced by our support of the CCHASM Thanksgiving Dinner ministry, Chesterfield Food Bank, and Place of Miracles Café.

On July 31, we will join together to Rise Against Hunger as our Sunday morning worship experience. Partnering with the national non-profit of that name, we will package 25,000 meals for distribution wherever they may be needed in the world.

According to the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, 821 million people around the globe do not get the food they need to lead a healthy life, and malnutrition is the single largest contributor to disease. In 2021, Rise Against Hunger distributed over 27 million meals in 29 countries and this year, we at Trinity can have an impact.

This is an "all hands-on-deck" mission event! Children over the age of 4 to elders under 104 can participate - there is a way for everyone to contribute. Set-up begins at 7:30 Sunday morning, meal packing from 9:00 to 11:00, followed by the take-down clean-up. We ask you to sign-up in advance, online at the link below, or if the internet is not your thing, complete a registration form on Sunday morning by July 24. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, famously proclaimed, "the world is my parish!" On July 31, we can serve the world.

The 12 ladies had a pleasant afternoon doing some mission-related business and having time to chat with each other, over refreshments provided by Ann Wright and Barbara Smith. They voted to send \$300 to Camp Baker for their summer camping and respite programs. Several ladies in the group are interested in becoming "secret pals" for the counselors at Camp Baker. Many of them are foreign students who are away from home for the entire summer.

The ladies assembled and sent 27 hygiene kits to the Virginia Annual Conference and will later send money to purchase 10 buckets of cleaning supplies, both of which will be sent to disaster areas in the coming year.

The UMW ladies will also be providing homemade cookies for dessert each Wednesday evening for the children attending Vacation Bible School. The next UMW meeting will be Thursday, Sept. 8 at 1 p.m., and all ladies of the church are invited to attend.

Let U\$ Help With That!

Some of us have our sights set on college or vocational school in the fall. Special Endowment Fund money is available as "scholarship" for undergraduate, community college and professional trade school students. The student must be a member of Trinity UMC. Funds will be paid directly to the school; up to \$1,000 per semester, a maximum of \$2,000 per calendar year. Second semester of 2022 funds are available beginning July 1, 2022.

A Place of Miracles Café

Members of Trinity have been volunteering at the "Cafe" for several years. We've talked about Melissa Morgan and her struggles to find a permanent home for her ministry. She signed a lease on the Café's new home and began to renovate the space before Covid hit. Covid disrupted her plans just like it disrupted worship at Trinity. Money was limited and the renovation project was limping along as funds were available.

Early this year, the Holy Spirit led Alan to ask Trinity to step in and help bring the renovation to fruition. In February, our Administrative Council approved \$15,000 to complete construction at the Café.

The following work has been done over the past 4 months:

- An exterior door was installed, and interior doors have been hung.
- A dropped ceiling has been installed in the kitchen.
- Once the electrician mounts the lights in the dropped ceiling, his work will be complete.
- The roof was prepared to vent the stove.
- The hood over the stove has been installed and vented through the roof.
- 3 new heat pumps (like the ones in our church office) have been installed. One older heat pump needs to be remounted and the system needs to be charged to be complete.
- Interior painting has been started. Walls and the floor will be painted.
- Kitchen cabinets will be installed the week of June 20th.
- As painting is completed, Melissa will move storage shelves to their permanent locations and move furnishings back into the building.

Thanks to all of you for your donations and support of this project to assist the working poor folks along the Route 1 corridor.



Closing the Gap





Paul Nickerson is a church vitality coach and teacher. He stresses the importance of "Invitation!" This is a recent article from Paul.

Over 80% of people who come to a church do so because a member invited. But only 2% of church people are inviting anyone. And that is the gap that has to be closed. When I talk with church folk about inviting, here are some common responses I hear:

- "I don't think that person would be interested"
- "I invited them once and they said, "No".
- "I don't want to be a pest and ask again".
- "I invited them but they didn't show up".

All of the above are based on the idea that invitation is a "one and done" activity. In fact, *invitation is a process*. For many people, it may take five or six invitations before they come. Often a "no" is a "not yet" or "this isn't the right time". Our first invitation may be to the wrong event. For example, we may invite someone to a Sunday worship service when they really need to get to know some church people in small group or work on a mission project. For others, life situations such as struggling with a teenager, or facing a medical issue, may be the perfect time for an invitation.

My point is this: if we never invite or only invite once, we will miss many opportunities to introduce people to the faith and to our church. If someone says, "no", just keep walking with them. Invite them again to something else. Or it may be someone else's invitation down the road that comes at the right moment.

So, don't talk yourself out of inviting, just keep planting seeds and some will come to fruition, not necessarily on our timetable, but on God's schedule. Remember, you are not just inviting people to church, but to a life filled with hope, healing, generosity and peace.

"Behold, I make all things new." Revelation 21:5

It's always a good thing to look at functions and structures and assess if they are working efficiently, serving their purpose and moving the mission. So, over the last year, the Church Council has spent some time reading, praying and discerning if our current structure is efficiently, effectively and accountably moving and fulfilling our mission ("to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world"). The sense of the Council has been that it probably is not working as effectively or as efficiently as needed and that sometimes the mission gets lost in all the activities

and the "always done it that way" programs and processes.

Last month, the Council with caution, care, concern and prayer decided to move ahead and explore a restructuring of Trinity's administrative work (currently done by the Staff Parish Relations Committee, Finance Committee, Board of Trustees and Church Council). Knowing that *The UMC Book of Discipline* allows for flexibility and with the District Superintendent's permission to proceed and explore, the Council established a task force (made up of Judy Powell, Ruth Allyn, Tim Ruxton, Richard Wilkes and Herb Brynildsen) to work on the details of a restructuring based on a model suggested by the Pastor, endorsed by the District Superintendent and adopted in other UM churches, districts and Conferences. The model is known as SAS or Simplified Accountable Structure. The key to this model is Accountability. In this model, we are not only and importantly accountable to one another in leadership, but most importantly we are accountable to fulfilling the Mission of the Church. In this model we are accountable for aligning our ministries, programs, goals to fulfilling the Mission.

This model calls for a big change in how we do our administrative work and governance. To the point, this model would have us create a Leadership Board that would have all the responsibilities, tasks and authority the *Book of Discipline* assigns to the Staff Parish Relations Committee, the Finance Committee, the Board of Trustees and the Church Council – all in one board. The Leadership Board would be made up of 9-12 committed, faithful disciples who are members of Trinity Church, identified and nominated by the Nominations and Leadership Committee (chaired by the Pastor and Lay Leaders) and duly elected by the Charge Conference. The membership would be 'elected' in three classes. One class rotating off the Board each year. Once established, the usual term would be three years.

More information will be made available as we move ahead. Please keep the task force and this restructuring process in your prayers. The timeline would have the new structure in place for 2023. Town hall meetings for info and Q&A will be schedule for September. If you have questions, place them in the "Trinity's Restructuring" question box or email them to the church office.
