They had come from every village in Galilee and Judea, and from Jerusalem. Now the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal. (Luke 5:17)

Healing has been a focus of our spiritual life these last few months. From Advent to Lent, we have assumed the authority James prescribes for the church to anoint the sick with oil. One recent week, the theme of our morning Facebook devotional was "healing." Among the meaningful reflections, this one seemed to touch a number of people.

"Wherever there is healing and transformation, there will be skeptics. Whether among your family and friends, coworkers or social circles, there may be people who scoff and question any change in your life. We have to be careful not to allow the onlookers to distract us from the new direction God is leading us through or the change God is making in us. "Healing is not a one-time moment of magic. It is a pathway toward renewal, transformation, and restoration. Along the way, healing will require confronting old wounds, naming hard truths, giving up comfortable patterns, and courageously embracing new beginnings. Through it all, set your eyes firmly on where God is leading you, and not on those who seek to



held July 14<sup>th</sup> through 20<sup>th</sup> 2024 in the Colonial Heights/Petersburg area. This is an awesome week for high school age youth to make a huge impact in our local community. A teen camper must be 14 years old by the date of Work camp or be going into 9<sup>th</sup> grade the fall after camp, and may attend the summer after senior year. We can take "young adults – college age," though they are reminded the focus is on the High School age youth. Youth spend the week housed at a church or school in Colonial Heights which serves at our Work camp base for lodging, evening programs and food services. Each

youth is put into a work crew that they work and travel with for the week to a resident's home. Several Youth from our church have attended in the past, and loved it! We are already registered to take a Trinity group. Currently Stephanie and Katie Griffith, and Stephanie's nephew Jacob are planning to attend. If you have ever wondered how you could reach out to your neighbor or friend or stranger and offer them a place of worship, in a pleasant passive manner, then these eggs are the perfect opportunity.

**ORDERS:** Due Wednesday, March 13. We appreciate early orders.

You have two options to place your order: Email or Form

A. Email the information to Karen Sismour at: KJSismour@verizon.net.

Subject: Eggs – Your last name. (example: Eggs – Layman).

Include: Name on egg, Type of egg (butter cream or peanut butter), and the

Full name and phone number of person picking up the order.

B. Complete a form and drop form off at church in the basket in the sanctuary entrance. Please fill out one order form for each egg ordered. Forms are available in the basket.

\*\* Please do not mail forms. See Form notes below.

**PAYMENT:** Cash or check, payable to **TUMC**. (*Not UMW*). Enter "Easter Eggs" on the memo line. Prepayment is required. Place payment with forms in basket in the sanctuary entrance. Envelopes are provided. If you ordered by email, please put your name on the envelope.

\*\* Please do not mail payment. Please do not put payment in offering plate.

**PICKUP:** Wednesday, 3/20, through Palm Sunday, 3/24.

**FORMS** - Reminders if submitting paper form at church:

- 1. Complete one form for each egg, please.
- Include first and <u>last</u> name of person picking up.
   Orders are bagged according to the person picking it up.
- 3. Place a <u>checkmark ( $\sqrt{\ }$ )</u> next to either Peanut Butter or Butter Cream. Do not enter a number, like 3 Peanut Butter on one form. Do not check both types.
- 4. Print legibly, especially the name on the egg.
- 5. You only need to enter your contact info if you are not in the directory, and then on one form, not each form. If your contact info is in the directory, skip it.

This year's proceeds will be invested in three areas of Trinity life: the thriving Young Adult Group, tablecloths, and water fountains. The young adult ministry offers fellowship and service opportunities for college-age persons. Funds will go toward resources for this new group. Monies will also be used to replace the linen tablecloths and fix some of the water fountains.

Donations are appreciated, if you don't care for an egg, or want to contribute in addition to the egg cost. Please indicate on the memo line the donation only amount.


